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From the Director

Dear OLLI Members,

We're about to kick off another exciting year at OLLI at UNL—and I'm thrilled about what's ahead! This past year was one of our best ever, with record-breaking membership, strong enrollments, and outstanding courses, events, and travel opportunities. Thank you for helping make it all possible.

At the National Osher Conference this spring, I saw firsthand how OLLI at UNL stacks up—and I'm proud to report that we're doing as well (and often better) than most programs across the country.

As we move into a new year, we're committed to keeping OLLI one of the most affordable programs in the nation. For the **fifth straight year, we are not increasing membership or course fees.**

At the same time, we're managing growth thoughtfully, planning to add a program assistant to help support our expanding membership and statewide programming. One area where we've seen significant cost increases is in producing and mailing the printed course catalog.

In 2024–25, our **catalog production** and mailing costs rose nearly **\$4,000 over the previous year.** Each printed catalog now costs almost **\$2.50.** To help manage these rising expenses, we're making a few changes to the printed catalog:

- ▶ Course descriptions have been reduced in length.
- ▶ The format will change slightly to utilize the page space better.
- ▶ **A QR code will be added** to the catalog so you can easily view full course descriptions, photos and artwork.

We know how much many of you enjoy flipping through the printed catalog, and we'll continue to offer it. But if you're open to going digital, you'll help us keep OLLI sustainable and affordable for everyone.

We urge you to consider opting out of the printed catalog and using the full-color online version instead. To indicate this choice, select **"Go Green"** in your student profile in the online registration system.

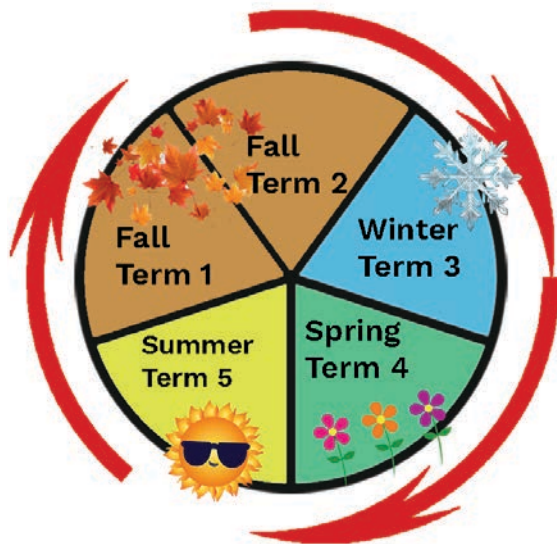

Use Zoom for Your OLLI Course

Where's my Zoom link?

- You'll get a confirmation email after you register and pay—this includes your Zoom link.
- You'll also get a reminder email four days before your class starts with the same link.
- Sign into your online account and click the head-and-shoulder icon ("My Account") in the red bar. Then click "Class List" to find Zoom links for all your courses in the far right column.

Tip: Create a folder in your inbox labeled "OLLI Zoom" so you can easily find these emails. Printing them is helpful too.

What do I need to use Zoom?

At minimum, a phone works—but for the best experience, use:

- A computer, tablet, or smartphone with a camera and microphone
- A headset or headphones (optional, but improves sound quality)

How do I join my class?

- No Zoom account needed—just download the free app or program the first time you join.
- Give yourself 5 minutes before class to get set up!
- Just click the Zoom link in your email to enter.
- Same link every week for multi-session classes.

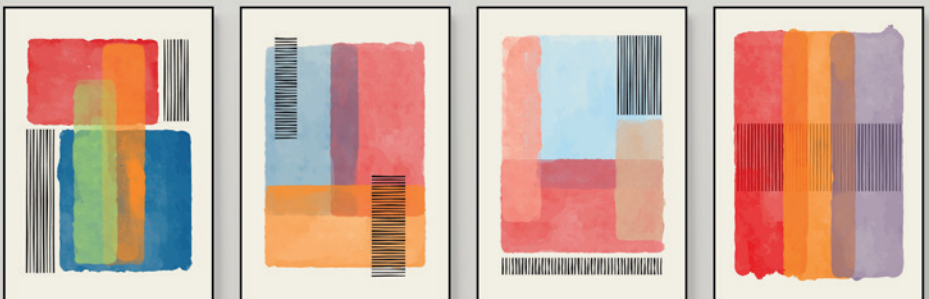
OLLI Art Show Reception

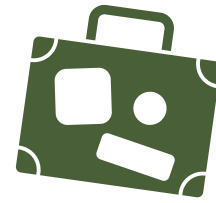

The Incredible Beauty and Diversity of Prairies

Instructor: Chris Helzer (1 session)

Nebraska is rich with prairie habitat. Photographer and ecologist Chris Helzer highlights the more intriguing inhabitants of Nebraska’s prairies, including the tiny ones that are the most important. Find out how milkweed is pollinated through a series of accidents; a caterpillar that camouflages itself with its own food; unlike honeybees, Nebraska bees live solitary lives; and much more.

Caring and Sharing for the Land

Instructors: Margaret Jacobs & Kevin Abourezk (3 sessions)

Land stewards in southeast Nebraska from the Nature Conservancy, Solidago Conservancy, the Audubon Society, and tribal nations discuss how they are preserving and revitalizing our prairies, woodlands, and waterways.

Should Nebraska Adopt Ranked Choice Voting?

Instructor: Wes Dodge (1 session)

Learn why ranked choice voting could improve Nebraska’s government and give voters the power they deserve. Instead of voting for one candidate in a race, voters rank candidates by preference. Explore how ranked choice voting ensure we are always represented by someone who receive a majority vote.

Opening the Mysteries of Our Universe:

The James Webb Space Telescope

Instructor: Bob Kacvinsky (1 session)

The James Webb Space Telescope has allowed scientists to look deeper, further, and more clearly into the early universe following the Big Bang. Infrared sensors allow the telescope to peer through the dust of objects providing an x-ray deep

into the interiors of deep space objects unlike any previous telescope reviews. Review key discoveries that have changed our thinking of how we see the universe today.

How Can U.S. Democracy Survive & Thrive:

Why Good Governance Really Matters

Instructor: Roman Pryjomko (1 session)

UN Advisor Roman Pryjomko discusses the “gift of democracy” and the concerns of democracy, that he believes, is under threat, not just in the United States, but all around the world. He believes a democratic system of governance strives to improve human well-being and peace of mind, ensuring freedom of all people to lead the lives that they choose, without prejudice or fear. Can democracy survive?

Aging with Intention

Instructor: Julie Masters (1 session)

Aging is an opportunity, not just an event. It is a time of possibilities to become something greater than ourselves. It is also a time to see that our lives are so much more than simply existing. We can make a difference as we age if we are willing to age with intention.

Contemporary Indigenous Art

Instructors: Jessica Moore, Ashley Wilkinson
(2 sessions)

This course showcases the work of Indigenous artists living on and engaging with the Great Plains, with special attention to the Otoe-Missouria. The course focuses on themes and issues in contemporary Indigenous art of the Great Plains, including presentations by artists and curators.

Faith in the Public Square: Religion in Politics

Instructor: Kaitlin Reece (1 session)

From the pulpit on Sunday mornings to the bullying pulpit of the American presidency, what role does religion play in our political life? Explore the latest research in the fields of sociology and political science about the role of faith in the public square.

Powerful Queens and Warrior Women

Instructor: Vanessa Gorman (6 sessions)

The course explores female leaders in the

premodern world; how they got their power, how they exercised it, and what their legacy grew to be. Learn about coercive regents, vengeful widows, women who were warriors, Christian mystics and martyrs, and religious manipulators.

The Life and Legacy of Dr. Susan LaFlesche Picotte

Instructor: Joe Starita, Nancy Waltman, Elizabeth Brown (3 sessions)

The first Native American female doctor in U.S. history earned her medical degree in 1889 and was a member of the Omaha tribe in Nebraska. She returned to her people to serve them on the 1,350 square miles of their Nebraska reservation. Her public health dedication caused a privately funded hospital in Walthill, NE to open in 1913. It is now being restored for medical and community use. Learn how Dr. Picotte overcame racial and gender inequality to lead her people and advocate for social reform.

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2025 OLLI Fall Symposium

Global and Regional Water Issues: Challenges & Solutions

Water is one of the most critical resources for sustaining life, agriculture, and economic development. Challenges such as scarcity, pollution, climate change, and equitable distribution continue to threaten water security worldwide and right here in Nebraska.

This symposium will begin with an overview of global water issues. Then, the focus will move to a more regional approach, with presentations and discussions exploring such topics as groundwater depletion, agricultural runoff, and the sustainability of the Ogallala Aquifer.

Experts will examine policies, conservation strategies, and scientific advancements aimed at securing water resources for future generations. This event is essential for researchers, farmers, policy makers, and anyone concerned about water's role in shaping the future of our environment and economy.

2. **Releasor** realizes that participation in the Activities involves certain risks and dangers. **Releasor** has hereby been made aware that participation in the Activities may have the following non-exclusive list of certain risks which I accept: death; head, eye, neck, and spinal injury resulting in complete or partial paralysis; brain damage; heart attack; blisters; cuts; lacerations; abrasions; concussions; contusions; strains; sprains; dislocations; fractures; cold and heat injuries; water immersion; drowning; lightning strikes; injury to bones, joints, muscles, internal organs; and environmental conditions. In addition, I understand and accept the incidental risks of travel to and from the site of activity; participation at sites that may be remote from available medical assistance; and the possible reckless conduct of other participants.
3. Consequently, while understanding that the **UNIVERSITY** has taken precautions to provide organization, supervision, and equipment for reasonable safety, **Releasor** assumes joint and personal responsibility for safety while participating in the Activities. Pursuant to that joint and personal responsibility, **Releasor** agrees to comply with the instructions and direction of representatives and staff members of the University. **Releasor** understands that failure to abide by the instructions and rules may result in his/her termination from the activity. **Releasor** accepts personal responsibility to ensure that any equipment needed to participate in the the Activities and used by the **Releasor** is safe and functioning properly and to refrain from causing loss or damage to the property of the **University**. **Releasor** realizes that he/she is solely responsible for any personal equipment, supplies, or property he/she may choose to use during the duration of the Activities.
4. **Releasor** further agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the **UNIVERSITY** for any and all claims or actions as a result of engaging in, using **University** facilities and equipment, or receiving instruction for the Activities or any activities incidental thereto whatsoever, whenever, or however the same may occur.
5. **Releasor** is aware that if he/she uses a vehicle not operated by the **University** for transportation to, at, or leaving the activity site, the **University** is **NOT** responsible for any damage caused by or arising from **Releasor's** use of such vehicle. Furthermore, **Releasor** acknowledges that he/she is solely responsible for any action he/she takes outside the scope of those actions permitted by the **University** for purposes of the particular activity regardless if occurring before, during, or after the duration of the activity. **Releasor** agrees to follow University policies when operating a University owned vehicle.
6. In consideration of participation in the Activities, **Releasor** hereby **RELEASES** and covenants not-to-sue the **UNIVERSITY** for any and all present and future claims resulting from ordinary negligence on the part of the **UNIVERSITY** for property damage, personal injury, or wrongful death arising as a result of his/her engaging in, using **University** facilities and equipment, or receiving instruction for the Activities or activities thereto, wherever, whenever, or however the same may occur. **Releasor hereby voluntarily waives** any and all claims or actions resulting from ordinary negligence, both present and future, that may be made by **Releasor's family, estate, personal representative, heirs, or assigns**.

I have read and understand that this **WAIVER** is intended to be as broad and inclusive as permitted by the laws of the State of Nebraska. I further agree the venue for any legal proceeding shall be in the State of Nebraska. I understand the rights that I am **waiving** and that I am freely signing this **WAIVER AND RELEASE**. I have read and fully understand that by signing this agreement I am giving up legal rights and remedies, which may be available to me for ordinary negligence of the **UNIVERSITY**. I further agree to follow and abide by the regulations and rules of the **UNIVERSITY** as they pertain to the Activities and to reimburse and make good to the **UNIVERSITY** any loss, damage, or cost the **UNIVERSITY** may have to pay as a result of my participation in the program.

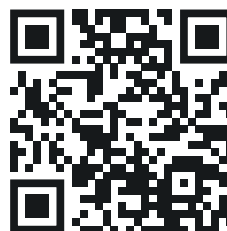
